Landfill Opposition

The action committee of fighthelandfill.co.uk are awaiting a judicial review of Cardiff County Council's executive committee decision to investigate land below Rhydlafar and at J33 as potential landfill sites for municipal waste. The proposal is being strongly opposed by opposition groups on the council and following a successful notice of motion, Cardiff County Council have undertaken to focus on a regional waste disposal solution with other authorities including Newport and The Vale and to come to a decision on the issue by July 2007.

The action committee and Cllr Delme Bowen have requested that the matter be resolved as soon as possible. Meanwhile, new planning applications for a Park and Ride transport hub have been submitted at Junction 33 of the M4 motorway.

Christmas Message from the Vicar of Pentyrch

Dear Friends,

The invention of the television has made it possible for folk to see people, things, places and events that until then they had only been able to hear about or listen to through the radio, newspapers and other literature. This opened up a whole new world to people as television brings pictures from round the globe as events happen. It makes all the difference to be able to have the pictures in front of us and to see people makes it much more personal and we feel more involved.

Personal communications these days are more sophisticated than ever. Thanks to modern technology such as the Webcam or videophone we can not only hold a conversation but also see the person we talking to even in different parts of the world via the web or a satellite link, and if it is a relative or close friend we are in touch with, how special that is, particularly if a family occasion is being marked. We thank God for the skills of all who have made this possible. We also thank for our sight and remember those who are not able to see.

As a licensed amateur radio operator I speak to other "hams" over the radio from home. Most of the people I speak to, some of whom have become "on air friends", I have never seen. However if we do meet it is good to put a face to the voice, the name, the call sign.

People have always wondered what God is like. In the Old Testament we read how God spoke through His servants – through great leaders such as Abraham and Moses, through Kings and poets, such as David and the Psalms and especially through the prophets such as Isaiah and Jeremiah. People heard about God from what they were told by His servants. But no one had ever seen God.

Postcard from Pentyrch

Dear Sally,

Well I've been working as the Clerk to Pentyrch Community Council for over a year now. Doesn't time fly when you're having fun? So many things have happened since I last wrote that I hardly know where to begin.

The biggest story in the last few months has been the Creigiau Landfill proposals which have had the whole area up in arms and quite rightly so. The County Council were being really sneaky trying to slide something like this through a committee but there has been a spirited resistance, not just from Community Council area but also from St Fagans as well. The action committee have got a web-site up and running to keep residents informed of what is happening. If you want to have a look it's on

www.fightthelandfill.co.uk.

Strangely back in August the PCC received a planning application from a group seeking to put a park and share scheme together at junction 33. It would be right next to and, in fact, on some of the land proposed for the landfill site. There is also a business park proposed for the area. Isn't it odd that if the landfill site had never been considered then there may well have been objections to these proposals; but in the light of the landfill site this proposal appears to be a benign alternative? Perhaps I'm just getting cynical!

I almost hesitate to mention the Frog Pond but before going to press last June I knew the matter was going to be discussed [again] at the Council meeting of 19th June. It was decided, in view of the objections, not to remove the ducks. You would have thought that that would be that but no, the Frog Pond was not finished with me yet, as a Councillor reported that he had seen a terrapin in the pond. I did initially suspect an over indulgence of the falling down water, but when one of the Community maintenance officers confirmed not just one but possibly two terrapins; I had to concede that my concerns over the temperance of a particular councillor were misplaced. When we had the Frog Pond cleared of weeds and overgrowth in the summer, I particularly asked the Conservation volunteers to seek and destroy the terrapin. However he evaded their clutches and currently lurks in the depths of the frog pond.

Postcard from Pentyrch (continued)

It would seem that my bleating about fly-tipping and litter generally has had an effect as, thanks to the sharp eyes of two residents, two prosecutions are underway for fly-tipping. I can't tell you how delighted I was to hear that some ne'er do well was caught tipping a load of industrial waste on Tyn y Coed Road. It fair restores your faith in human nature. So I hope everybody continues to be vigilant. If you see anything fishy don't forget to take down the registration numbers of suspicious vehicles, pass them on to me and I'll tell the Police.

Have you heard the latest about Cardiff County Council? Not only do they blunder about with planning for the future, [which is why we're in the mess we are in with the landfill issue,] but they also aren't very good with managing their budgets. It would seem that Social Services were £6 million in debt in October! Good budgeting - I don't think so! All departmental managers were running around like headless chickens wondering where cuts could be made to make up the deficit. Well the fall-out from our perspective was that one of the areas they were going to make cutbacks was on the maintenance of footpaths. Now there are two men Paul and Julian who do all the maintenance of the footpaths in the Cardiff area. They work really hard but are not employed directly by Cardiff and are employed by an agency. They were told that they may lose their jobs, although it's a safe bet that the bureaucrat's jobs were safe though! Just before going to press I was told that their jobs had been saved? Thank goodness for that!

Incidentally the Community Council is no longer paid for any work carried out on footpaths by Cardiff County Council. You can still report problems with footpaths to me and I will pass them on or you can contact the Footpaths Department directly. Work on the access road from Ty Nant will start soon with completion of the tunnel access in 2008. A temporary concrete plant has been installed at the quarry. The meeting also discussed the problems of fly-tipping and motorbikes. Cemex, the quarry company is funding an off-road bike for the Police.

QUESTIONS AFTER CCC APPROVE NEW ACCESS AT TŶ NEWYDD

CCC granted planning for this new access on September 18th. While residents accept that the Council has to determine applications according to planning law, the decision to approve this application causes great concern. Because of the illegal felling which created the application site, there are strong public feelings about planning at Ty Newydd.

The Action Committee is concerned that the Application, which was sent out for consultation, was amended before it went to the Planning Meeting. No one in the village was informed. In the amended plan, dated 14th September, the residential lay-by has gone and the angle of exit is altered to form a splay in both directions to Main Road. The 'existing footpath' changes to footpath and 'drive regraded'. A retaining wall to a bank is added and note is made to 'stray wires' from the pole mounted transformer. There is now a 'new gate' over the access to Main Road and a second 'pedestrian passgate' nearer to the stream. Changes to the drainage are indicated. We had no sight of this plan until the planning meeting.

It was impossible to assess the photocopy of the hand-altered plan during the meeting. Sandie Rosser was put in the embarrassing position of reading a statement from the village with comments irrelevant to the amended plan. Unfortunately, Councillor Priday was on holiday and there was no one to speak for us. 50 signatures were needed for permission to speak. Our precious three minutes were wasted on inaccurate references. It made a nonsense of the extensive input from the village. The Action Committee awaits a response from CCC about procedures leading to the amended plan. What meetings had taken place? How could the village comment on a plan it had not seen?

The planning process allows that insubstantial amendments do not necessarily require a new application if alterations are minor (De Minimus) or if they relate to an uncontroversial application. It is left to the discretion of the Planning Director. But this application had changed substantially and is controversial. As such, according to Planning Guidelines, it should have been re-sent for consultation. We are waiting to hear who should have


