This year the S4C television Welsh soap opera, Pobl y Cwm, is celebrating its 30th anniversary and received a thirtieth birthday present to remember – a place in the Royal Television Society's Hall of Fame. The long-running drama produced by BBC Cymru is the first programme, rather than individual person, to receive the honour.

But where is Cwmderi? The mythical village where everything is happening. Some say its between Llanelli and Carmarthen in Cwm Gwendraeth. But if you keep a close eye in this area you'll find the residents of Pobl y Cwm preparing for action. They were last seen at the Gwaelod y Garth Village Hall producing a Christmas pantomime. Pentyrch Rugby Club is a favourite haunt for some of the characters. Many of the local children had their first break on television in the action at Gwaelod y Garth School.

If we go over the mountain to Efail Isaf you'll find a chapel which is identical to the one in Cwmderi. It has seen more televised weddings and funerals than any other chapel in Wales.

So keep an eye out for Cwmderi people in our villages.

Christmas Message

A Christmas Message from the Rev. John Binny, Vicar of Pentyrch with Capel Llanilltern.

Dear Friends,

One thing the Christmas story is genuinely and obviously about is peace. Everyone wants peace, but what is this peace which is the object of our deepest longing?

Peace often refers to the cessation or resolution of hostilities. All through this year Iraq has been in our thoughts and prayers and the hopes of 2003 have yet to be realised with conflict, terrorism and bloodshed contributing to continuing instability as various factions vie against each other, whilst the appointed government leaders, the leaders of other nations and armed forces strive to work for peace. In Iraq as in some other conflicts in history, when there has been a pause in fighting, often this peace has been temporary – it slips away and has to be won again. We continue to pray for Iraq, its people and all working for permanent peace and stability.

Secondly there is the peace of escape or retreat. At times we feel things are getting on top of us and we want to get away from it all – have a break. In the midst of preparations for Christmas we may long to have time to ourselves to pause – have some peace. Very commendable and beneficial if it is possible but, of course we do have to return to the busy-ness of our lives.

The Christmas gift of peace is the gift of God's presence and purpose in Jesus Christ. At the first Christmas God Himself became one of us that we might for ever be one with Him and with each other. The Christmas promise is peace to people of good will. So the angels sang, and so it must always be. Without sincere and active goodwill in people's lives there can be no peace worth the name. Peace comes when we have made room for it in our noisy and crowded lives and that we can do by turning out as many as we can of our mutual suspicions, prejudices, ancient feuds, grudges and fears. And we do this by the overwhelming pressure of new faith, a new hope, a new good will, a new spirit striving to enter in.

We can reflect on the love and peace in that stable in Bethlehem on the first Christmas night – peace in the hearts of Mary and Joseph, the peace of the Christ – Child. In His Ministry, His death and resurrection Jesus showed the love of God for each one of us and in Jesus

people knew the peace of God He brought to their lives. As we make room for Jesus in our lives we know His presence is with us always. The Christmas story means God has got involved in our lives. Jesus is Emmanuel – God with us always.

We pray for peace in our world, peace in our lives and the lives of all people, and we thank God for the gift of His Son, the Prince of Peace, to fill our hearts that we may know His love with us this Christmas time and always.

A very happy and peaceful Christmas and New Year to you all.

Creigiau Scout Group – A Busy Year

The Creigiau Scout Group continues to be very successful. There are currently around 120 members from Beavers aged 6 to Explorers aged 18, with 11 warranted leaders and another 12 people who help on a regular basis in the various sections. The Group is almost full, with a long waiting list for the Beavers in particular.

The Scout Group is a very active club with a busy programme of activities throughout the year. Highlights this year have been the Beaver Area fun day at the Amelia Trust Farm and a sleepover for the older Beavers who experienced their first night away as Scouts. The Cubs held their annual camp at Ystradgynlais and look forward to their Christmas Fayre at the end of November, at which they raise money for charities from selling their handmade crafts.

The Scouts spent a weekend on Flat Holm and enjoyed their summer camp in Sherwood Forest, two events of an exceptionally busy year. The Explorers had a walking week in the Isle of Skye and also a camp in Guernsey. 4 members also went to the Czech Republic to camp with Czech Scouts. Most of the Explorers are involved with the Duke of Edinburgh Award scheme and are busy with their expeditions at various levels.

Over the next year or so, we need to focus on replacing the Scout Hall, which is rapidly nearing the end of its useful life and also on replacing the minibus that we have used well over the past few years. We are looking into ways of raising money for replacing the Scout Hut and minibus and welcome any local support. One annual fundraising effort is the Scout Christmas Post. Stamps will be on sale towards the end of October and we urge everybody to support this, as it is one of our main fund raising efforts.

The Pentyrch Rangers U16's football team have played together in the Cardiff and District League since the age of 7. The 2004/5 season is their last year in the league and as a result they were keen to celebrate the last 10 years in a special way.

As a result the team have decided to have a year of charity events for a nominated charity, chosen by the boys. After researching a host of different charities they decided to raise funds for the Teenage Cancer Trust, who are currently raising funds to build the first specialist teenage unit in Wales, at the University Hospital of Wales, Cardiff. The Unit is to be built on stilts between the adult and paediatric oncology centres at the hospital and will be fitted with all the components that now come as standard in Teenage Cancer Trust units - games consoles, wide screen TVs, DVDs, keyboards, guitars, computers, kitchens - to escape hospital food, as well as digital lighting and interactive systems all with cutting edge design. The special units enable the teenagers to receive treatment in a welcoming environment and with other young adults of their own age.

The boys are planning to hold a series of events over the season and this commenced with members of the team competing in the Cardiff 10K road race raising monies by sponsorship. The boys have also received support from local companies including Julian Hodge Bank who have agreed to match fund the monies raised on a £ for £ basis. Bus Service

The Pentyrch Buses will take a new route from Monday 15th November. The bus will turn right at the Heol y Pentre junction as usual, stopping at the existing stops at the shop and on Bronllwyn. However instead of turning at the Penuel Road junction the bus will continue along Penuel Road, Bron Haul, Lon y Fro, stopping outside number 19 Lon y Fro, up Heol y Pentre and back out of the village. Buses travelling to Creigiau will not be affected.

Dave Jenkins Heritage Initiative

This year's award was won by Creigiau Primary School for the Class 4 research into the history of Creigiau producing posters to encourage people to come to Creigiau.

Ducks or Frogs

There has been concern about the number of ducks on the frog pond in Creigiau. Here are a few thoughts from the RSPB -

Feeding ducks is popular but can cause problems, particularly on enclosed waters that aren't flushed by rivers or regular flooding. The population of birds on a pond and the food supply are very closely linked. More food means more mallards.

A regular supply of extra food can lead to artificially large numbers of ducks nesting in the area and also encourage large numbers of unattached birds (particularly males) to stay. Many females are forced to nest away from the pond, increasing the danger to newly-hatched ducklings.

If the food supply remains reliable and adequate for all the ducks over a long period of time, the population can increase from year to year and the birds will become increasingly sedentary. Increasing build up of droppings in the pond favours the growth of algae, which smothers aquatic plants and can deprive the water of oxygen.

PROTECT AND RESPECT

I would like to bring awareness to all dog owners of the very real risk posed to livestock by just a few irresponsible owners. Whilst the majority whom walk their dogs in the local countryside are extremely responsible there is a minority who think that they can clip the lead off their dog and let them run free. NOT SO !! Dogs must be kept under close and complete control at all times, and on a lead where livestock is grazing, even on mountain and Common land, and that includes the Garth Mountain. Believe it or not even your dog can cause absolute mayhem in the countryside.

We picked up a ewe on the Garth last week with horrific injuries caused by a dog. Almost all her jaw and half her face and ear had been ripped off and several weeks previously I picked up a ewe by the Gwaelod y Garth cattle grid, her throat had been torn open by a dog, she died within hours of me bringing her home to treat her. The tremendous shock and stress that they experience during a much lesser attack is enough to kill them.

PLEASE, if you walk in the countryside with your dog, keep it on a lead at all times. It is the home and workplace of we farmers and we treat our livestock and the countryside with the greatest respect and ask all visitors to do likewise So please remember: PROTECT AND RESPECT

CHRISTMAS AND NEW YEAR WALK

A WALK COVERING FOUR TYPES OF TERRAIN IN ABOUT TWO HOURS, 3.5 MILES.

PLEASE FOLLOW THE COUNTRYSIDE CODE AND WEAR SUITABLE CLOTHING BEWARE OF SUDDEN WEATHER CHANGES ON MOUNTAINS. ALWAYS CARRY A MAP AND COMPASS AND TELL SOMEONE WHERE YOU ARE GOING

MAPS: OS. Pontypridd and Caerphilly sheet ST 08/18. 1:25000 GR. 118831(NANTY-GARTH) GR. 101825 (PENTYRCH). OS. Cardiff and Newport sheet 171 1:50,000.

START: Nant-y-Garth Gwaelod-y-Garth, or Pen-y-Waun Pentyrch **
DISTANCE/TIME: 3.5 miles approx. 12 hours approx.

DIFFICULTY AND TERRAIN: Moderate, climbing the Garth taking some effort. The walk encompasses forestry, open moorland, fields and woodland, including a nature reserve. Steep and boggy in some places. A low level option is available. Continue along mountain road to emerge at Pinecroft Cattery then rejoin route instead of climbing the Garth *.

POINTS OF INTEREST: Earth works and tumuli are to be seen on the Garth the first ridge being modern and dating from 1940. The others including the Trig point date from the early to middle Bronze Age circa 2000 b.c. and are examples of round barrows.

START at Nant-y-Garth in the village of Gwaelod-y-Garth, park with due consideration for residents. Walk to the back corner of Nant-y-Garth and take the steps and through a gate following the path to your left. ** Join the lane and head straight up the lane looking out for the sign for Maesgwyn as a guide. Follow the rural lane as it climbs up to a gate and stile enclosing forestry, Maesgwyn house is on your left. Enter the forest and head straight

until you join the main path junction turning right here. Soon a crossroads appears; take the left fork to climb towards the Garth Mountain, roughly NW. After the climb steep in sections you are faced by a gate, cross the field to an old Kissing Gate (sadly in decline) and join the mountain road. Turn left following the Mountain road as it climbs past an old barn on your left until you see a path on your right marked with footpath signs* . Start the climb of the Garth watching your footing and crossing a spring on route. Ahead of you is the peak, stop here and admire the views. Turn around and head up the steep bank this leading you to higher point on the mountain. From here head west using the distant trig point as a guide, follow the path until it forks right followed by a short climb ending flat on top of the Garth Take any of the three paths that run to the trig point or pimple as locals know it.

At the trig point you are standing at 307 meters or just over 1000feet. Enjoy the views including the Brecon Beacons and over Cardiff and the Bristol Channel. Spot the new Millenium Stadium in Cardiff rising like a giant spider out of the City. Facing Cardiff descend towards the village of Pentyrch, looking out for houses on your right towards the bottom and passing a picnic area to your left: Join the tarmac lane as it meets up with the mountain road, turning right crossing a cattle grid and descending to join the Efail Isaf road.* Turn left at Pinecroft Cattery and follow the road to Pentyrch turning left at a bend and house named Twyn-y-Geirwen. Cross the stile and head straight through the top of a housing development keeping straight until you arrive at a group of houses **. Head straight down the drive of Steveden house to a narrow passage containing a small stile, cross this into the field beyond.

This field contains a stile at the bottom, roughly to your right and bearing N.E. Take care here as it is very muddy and look out for an old railway carriage as a guide. At the stile turn left and head for some stables crossing another stile on

route, then head for a gate in the top eastern corner of the field. From here you have a nice view of the Garth, and you can retrace your footsteps up the Garth. Immediately to your left is another stile cross this and keep to the top of the field bordering the road until you reach the stile entering Coed-y-Bedw.

There are many paths through this nature reserve but we shall take the more scenic away from the road. After a short while turn left and descend through the woods crossing two bridges and keeping right to follow the water on your right hand side. Note the small waterfall to your right. Cross a small stream and travel straight ahead noting the ruin to your left and an old drift mine, barely visible now, and cross a small bridge. Enter a grassy clearing and watch for a frog pond on your left as you leave. Sharp left descend steps and slippery boardwalk to reach the stream in the base of the valley. Another bridge , climb some steps and turn right and follow the stream out of the reserve turning left where a large bridge crosses the stream. Cross the stile turning right down a green lane meeting the stream again plus a pile of mossy rocks. Left here over stile into forestry to emerge at the gate to Georgetown. Right at the end of the houses and you join the lane and path back to Nant-y-Garth. FOR PENTYRCH STARTERS turn left at the end of the houses and head up the lane to Maesgwyn **.

TOP MARKS FOR VILLAGE SCHOOL

Pupils, staff and governors of Creigiau Primary School have received an outstanding report from inspectors following an inspection there earlier this summer.

With just over 400 pupils on the roll, it is one of only two parallel language stream schools in Cardiff and has featured regularly in the Sunday Times list of the top primary schools in Wales. Inspectors found that 'Creigiau Primary School is a very good school where pupils display very high standards in terms of behaviour, attainment and achievement'. They graded all subjects and aspects of school life as either 'Very Good' or 'Good'. For Key Stage 1 in 2003, 100% of pupils achieved level 2 in the core subject areas and at Key Stage 2, over 93% attained level 4 or above. The inspectors note that 'These figures are well above the county and national averages.'

The report, just published by the inspection team appointed by Estyn, adds that 'The school provides a happy,

stable and caring environment for all its pupils'.

Headmaster Peter Evans welcomed the report and felt that 'it was built upon the foundations of a strong collaborative spirit within the school and the local community'. Mr Evans added that 'the task now was to focus on maintaining the high standards in a school which knows how to work hard but with a smile on its face'.

The County Council have for some time now agreed to the appointment of two lollipop people to ensure safe road crossing at both sites.
