

## Report from Creigiau Ward Surgery Held in the Creigiau Church Hall on 17<sup>th</sup> February 2018

1. I attended the meeting and updated residents who have raised concerns previously.

### **Concerns of Residents**

2. Toni Young expressed a concern about erratic rubbish bin collections from her property on Tyn-y-Coed Road Pentyrch. The road where she lives is narrow and there is no kerbing where she can safely leave rubbish bins for collection. If bins are left at the bottom of her drive then they are often damaged as vehicles trying to pass each other often hit them. If she leaves them safely a metre or so onto her property then often they are not emptied. She has raised this matter several times with Cardiff CC but it seems they are unable to understand and respond to the problem. Given its costing the council to replace her bins if they suffer vehicle collision damage, which has happened several times a swift and smart resolution is needed.
3. A resident of Maes-y-Sarn, Pentyrch asked again why there are no yellow lines in the area of the junction of Heol-y-Bryn and Bronllwyn.
4. A Creigiau Resident reported that the footpath between the Cardiff Road and Parc-y-Coed near the Church Hall is almost impassable to people walking and a considerable hazard to disabled, and infirm people and asked if we could report the matter to Cardiff Council and encourage some action.
5. Several Creigiau Residents complained about the notices on Creigiau Recreation Ground apparently restricting the areas in which dogs can be exercised. Residents want to know when this was decided by PCC and why there was no consultation. Considerable anger was expressed. I am going to view these notices before the next PCC meeting as I was unaware council had agreed to notices being displayed in this way.
6. A late report and a mass of complaints received on Saturday evening about the proposed changes to the 124 and 136 bus routes.  
*“Stagecoach will be conducting a public consultation on removing the 136 bus during the day and replacing it with a modified 124 route. 124 would go to Creigiau as normal then Pentyrch, Gwaelod, Whitchurch, 3 Elms, College Rd, Black Lion, Cathedral Rd, Greyfriars. NO circular route around village. Information Bus near Shops in Pentyrch”* found on a Pentyrch Facebook page. Residents are demanding to know why the PCC has not been consulted

on this proposal which reduces the bus services and increases journey times to both Creigiau and Pentyrch.
