

**Report from Creigiau Ward Surgery Held in
the Creigiau Church Hall on 21st April 2018**

1. I attended the meeting and updated residents who have raised concerns previously.
2. Graham Thomas also attended.
3. Graham and I took time to explain the new Llaniltern Village plans to residents.
4. Thanks were expressed for PCC's support of the request to Persimmon to assist with St Catwgs connection to main services.

Concerns of Residents

5. All residents expressed major concerns about the plans for the new junctions and the consequent roadworks. The point was made that there seems to be no co-ordination of the roadworks along the A4119 and transit times into Cardiff are increasing as a result.
6. All residents asked what plans there were to provide improved public transport links as Plasdwr and Llaniltern Village are built out. They expressed disappointment that Cardiff City Council did not yet have definitive plans for these improvements and were generally appalled that Cardiff City Council were not going to do anything at all until significant numbers of the new houses were occupied.
7. Most residents expressed concern on the pressure on local schools and medical services due to the way Cardiff City Council has planned for their development to lag behind the occupation of new homes.
8. Many residents have demanded to know why Cardiff City Council is not insisting that the new gas main to service Llaniltern Village is not being brought across the fields rather than the current proposal of following the line of Heol Pant-y-Gored.
