

**Report from Creigiau Ward Surgery Held in
the Creigiau Church Hall on 21st July 2018**

1. I attended the meeting and updated residents who have raised concerns previously.

Concerns of Residents

2. Many residents expressed concern about a further closure of Tynant road. Some residents again mentioned aggressive driving behaviour by larger vehicles. A consensus from residents present was that they would like PCC to make representations to:
 - a. Ask for a speed limit of 20mph on Tynant road.
 - b. Ask for a vehicle weight restriction to prevent heavy vehicles using the narrow section of the road between the A4119 and Ffordd Dinefwr.
 - c. Ask that prominent "narrow lane" warning signs are put at either end of the narrow section.
 - d. Ask that consideration is given to making the narrow section one way.
 - e. Write to bus and coach companies asking them not to use the lane.There was again particular complaint about Creigiau Travel raised in this regard and a report of a driver using a mobile phone while driving.
3. Several residents mentioned the weeds growing in pavements and in the gutters of our village roads and want to know why this is not being attended to as the village is looking really scruffy.
4. A couple of residents assert that there are dedicated dog waste bins in Pentyrch and would like to see the same in Creigiau.
5. There is a large laurel hedge at the bottom of Parc-y-Fro near the junction by Tesco. This hedge is starting to obstruct the pavement.

The next Surgery will be held on 18th August 2018 at 10.00 hours in conjunction with the Coffee Morning at Creigiau Church Hall.
