

**Report from Creigiau Ward Surgery Held in
the Creigiau Church Hall on 16th February 2019**

1. I attended the meeting with Jena Quilter and updated residents who have raised concerns previously on any progress. Two of our community police officers also attended the coffee morning but were called away for operational reasons.

Concerns of Residents

2. Some residents enquired if the speed confirming signs (the ones that show actual speed in green if below the limit and red if above the limit) could be provided by PCC on the Cardiff Road / Heol Creigiau?
3. Information was provided on the gas mains works and current plans for same.
4. Provided advice on how to apply for a grant / sponsorship from PCC.
5. The police answered a number of questions from residents and provided advice.

The Police need 2 more volunteers from the PCC area for the speed monitoring scheme and ask that PCC publicise this widely to encourage more volunteers to come forward. They still have budget and a speed gun and Hi viz etc would be provided to PCC for the volunteers to use in designated areas. Radyr and St Fagans have schemes operating already.
Crime figures for PCC area will be provided separately.

The next Surgery will be held on 16th March 2019 at 10.00 hours in conjunction with the Coffee Morning at Creigiau Church Hall.
