PLANS FOR 650 NEW HOUSES SOUTH OF CREIGIAU



The Cardiff Local Development Plan in 2017 designated the land between the A4119 and the M4 motorway for development and we have all seen the works going on there for some time. As well as that, the land that lies between the existing estates off Ffordd Dinefwr and the A4119 was also designated for development in the L.D.P. The land owner, through his agents DPP Planning Consultants ran a Pre Application Consultation in the Golf Club on 16th July. These Pre applications consultations are only required in Wales and are for developments of over 25 houses. Many residents attended the exhibition and commented on the plans, but this is only the start of the process. This is not the planning application but that is likely to follow shortly. Comments made about this consultation are for the developers but must be included in their planning application. There will be an opportunity to submit comments to the County Council when an actual Planning application is made. It is likely the application will be submitted in August

The area covered by these plans is shown on the map. This is a 38.9 hectare site for approximately 650 new houses and will be a separate development from the one already underway by Persimmon Homes on the other side of Llantrisant Road. It will split into 3 separate

estates which will be separated by the ancient woodland on one side and the disused railway on the other. There is the potential for each 'parcel' to be sold off separately. There will be new site accesses, two of which will be from Llantrisant Road, and one from Cardiff Road. There will only be pedestrian and cycle access through the existing village estates apart from a provision for emergency vehicles in the event the A4119 being impassable

Also planned are pedestrian, bicycle and emergency only access to the north into the existing streets, protecting and opening up of ancient woodland for community use; pedestrian and cycle routes through the site; new play areas and a sustainable urban drainage system (SUDS)

Schools will be a crucial factor for this development and it is envisaged that rather than build a new school (as per the Persimmon development), they will make a contribution to Cardiff Council to develop existing facilities. Meetings are being had with relevant parties in the Council at this early stage to understand how this will work. We are also pressing for other community improvements such as traffic safety measures and communities' infrastructure and facilities.

Memorial Park Path

Cemex, Taffs Well Quarry have generously agreed to upgrade the grassy path that runs through Memorial Park. Work will take about 5 days and will be done in August. There is no pavement on Heol Goch at that point and it is dangerous for people walking to and from the shops, school buses, Village Hall and GP surgeries. Walking along the path over the rocky outcrop is slippery and dangerous. We hope to the new path will make it usable all year round. We are immensely grateful to Cemex for their generosity.

Site E

PCC members attended the Pre-Application Consultation (PAC) held at Creigiau Golf Club in July. There was a good attendance from residents who could look at the proposals and discuss them with the planning consultants. This is a new process and the first time a PAC has taken place in our area. We submitted our comments and know that many residents did too. This is the start of quite a long process of planning applications and comments. You can see PCC's response under Planning in this issue. Cardiff's Local Development Plan gave consent for development of the site so the planning process is now about the details of what will be built not whether the site should be developed.

Royal helicopter visit to Creigiau Recreation Area



At the end of June there was an unexpected phone call to the PCC office. It's not every day I get a call from the Queen's Flight! They asked for permission to land a helicopter at Creigiau Rec on July 1st but couldn't tell me why and I couldn't tell anyone they had called. That made it a bit tricky for me to explain to users of the Rec that certain things had to be done for what I called a 'police operation involving a helicopter'. But Creigiau Cricket Club moved the cover from the wicket – needed just in case the helicopter had to make an emergency landing and needed more space. We were not to cut the grass because the downdraught makes a whirling cloud of green. As it turned out, Prince Charles was visiting South Wales and was to be picked up in Creigiau to fly to his next appointment. I was allowed to tell people what was happening shortly before the aircraft arrived and some of us went to see it. We were amazed that we were able to get so close to it and take photographs (although not of the inside). All the police, Royal security team, pilots and ground crew were a delight to work with. They were most appreciative of the warm welcome we gave them and said we had made the visit particularly easy. The Rec proved to be rather an excellent helicopter landing spot so they may be back!

Community Speed Watch Volunteers

Local people have been trained and have been out and about watching for speeding vehicles. We hear that 36 vehicles were spotted exceeding the local speed limits in the first 4 weeks. It is hoped that the Speed Watch presence will persuade everyone to drive safely through our communities. We thank all the volunteers for giving up their time to help with an issue that affects so many.

Bench in Ael y Bryn

PCC has installed a bench in the Ael y Bryn Village Green open space. This was the suggestion of Cllr John Harrison and we are delighted to provide a new resting spot for those walking through the park.

July

- PCC submitted to Cardiff an initial list of required local infrastructure. With all the development in Creigiau, it was agreed to start with that Ward. This is the most positive step since the signing of the Charter. The PCC Village Plan Questionnaire formed the basis of the list. Mark Drakeford, AM was keen that S106 funds stay in the community.
- PCC submitted comments on the new Site E development, south of Creigiau, following the Pre-Application Consultation held at Creigiau Golf Club.
- Work on an upgraded path at Memorial Park will be generously carried out by Cemex, Taffs Well Quarry in August.
- PCC continues to press Natural Resources Wales for reassurance that Brofiscin Quarry is properly monitored and safe.
- PCC continues to work with Mark Drakeford AM on Post Officer service for Pentyrch and Gwaelod y Garth.

Post Offices

PCC has been working with Mark Drakeford, AM for some time to get a return of the Post Office in Pentyrch and recently in Gwaelod y Garth.

We have heard from Mark's office that in respect of Gwaelod, the situation is that an outreach service in the village hall had been provided by the Postmaster at Taffs Well. The Post Office reassure us that they are committed to restore services as soon as possible.

In Pentyrch, the Post Office closed and there was no interest from local retailers in taking on the Post Office opportunity. With new owners at the Spar, a new Post Office operator has been appointed who plans to restore a service at the former Post Office premises. We hope to be able to share further details about the service over the coming weeks.

Site E: Land South of Creigiau Pre-Application Consultation Response

Pentyrch Community Council made the following comments and observations, having attended the PAC event on July 16, met with residents on July 20 and discussed the issues at its Planning Committee meeting held on July 17.

- Noting and acknowledging the extant LDP Strategic Site allocations, we welcome the proposal to develop Site E as an extension to the existing village and are pleased to see there will be no through road traffic.
- We are pleased to see the provision of green amenity areas including play areas.
- We welcome the retention of the ancient woodland and expect that to remain unchanged in any further detailed applications that come forward.
- We are pleased to see that the old rail line has been protected for the future Metro which PCC is lobbying for and believes to be a key to transport in NW Cardiff.
- We are pleased to see a range of housing sizes and the inclusion of retirement living. We feel that it is very important to the future of the community to include housing across all age ranges. When older residents want to down-size they need smaller homes to move to if they want to remain close to friends and family.

We and our residents have the following concerns:

- We have witnessed the loss and destruction of wildlife habitat along the A4119 far in excess of what was expected from planning applications and the Local Development Plan. After this experience we ask that any green space and habitat that is to be retained and/or protected be given full protection in future applications. We do not want to see further examples of hedges appearing to be protected only for developers to argue that, after all, they have to go. We do not accept that saying a hedge can be translocated is a real and meaningful protection: it isn't.
- Cardiff's LDP spoke of the importance of local community identity. We supported that at the Masterplan stage and we ask that every consideration is given to designing Site E in a way that helps it feel part of Creigiau.
- Road traffic in the local area will grow enormously as a result of all development along the A4119. Site E will add directly to traffic on Ty Nant Road and Cardiff Road. Ty Nant Road is not suitable for the coming increase in traffic and we ask that as part of this development consideration is given to reducing its use as a short-cut

County Council Notes

Over the summer we have continued to be plagued by fly tipping. This is being taken seriously by Cardiff Council and there are prosecutions under way however more work is needed to solve this issue. The Council are also embarking on an education programme to prevent further occurrences. If you see any fly tipping please report it using the Council App. The app allows residents to report a number of issues and the more people that report an incident the more action we will see in the villages.

A number of residents have commented on the current state of the pavements and footpaths in the villages. I have been in contact with the Council and have been assured that action will be taking but this has yet to materialise. If there are any areas that are a particular issue please report them via the app or email me with the details. If we make enough noise then action will be taken.

We continue to get issues with HGV's in the villages and

and, for example, restrictive weight limits are set to reduce commercial traffic.

- We support the encouragement of cycling but note that the LDP's Strategic Route on the A4119 is not shown on your drawings.
- The local area has had drainage problems over the years and residents are particularly concerned that the new development does not exacerbate these or create new ones.
- Site E is a semi-rural location and we feel that high density housing is not appropriate. We are also concerned at the effects on existing houses and ask that the detailed designs make provision to protect the privacy, particularly where changes in elevation mean new properties will be looking down over existing ones.
- High density housing reduces the area of green space and brings more cars. We ask that the design details keep vehicles off streets, and allows more green space.
- We are concerned that there are reported instances of sewage overflow from the pumping station to the South of the existing houses along Ffordd Dinefwr. Residents would like some assurance that the plans will deal with this issue once and for all and not make it worse.
- Given the presence of the ancient woodland which is to be retained and the increase in the traffic volumes on the A4119 it would be good to see the installation of a pollution monitoring station as part of the proposal for site E.
- As a point of information. Some residents of the village of Creigiau have expressed concern about the potential negative effect on their property values.

Gwaelod Zebra



The planned work to introduce a Zebra crossing making the pedestrian route between Gwaelod and Radyr much safer started August 12 by contractors Alun Griffiths. There is a 6 week construction programme. A letter drop will be carried out shortly to inform the residents / businesses within the vicinity of the work. Information will also be available on the Council website www.cardiff.gov.uk/TransportProjects, and can be found by selecting the project under the 'current consultations' link.

despite a number of initiatives by the police there are still rogue drivers that ignore the warning signs and use the ward as a short cut. The police are unable to take action unless they are able to 'catch committing' which means they have to witness the incident. However trading Standard are able to investigate and if you witness any overweight vehicles please contact Shared Regulatory Services on 0300 123 6696 or via the website www.SRS.wales

At the time of writing this the tender for the G1 Bus in Gwaelod Y Garth has not been issued. The current plan is to ensure that the tender specifically requests changes to the current situation thus improving the reliability of the service. I will be working closely with the Council to ensure these improvements are delivered.

On a final note it was pleasing to see that the Llantrisant Road did not cause as much disruption as first anticipated. The works were well planned and well timed and hopefully any future works can be as successful.

The development will preserve the disused railway line through the site, which would be a public walkway and cycle route. However, it is also possible a future south Wales Metro could use it.

More detailed plans, maps, drawings and documents from the pre-application consultation are available at the Pentyrch Community Council Office at 1 Penuel Road, Pentyrch, and also on the website <https://dppukltd.com/creigiau/>

Once the outline planning application has been submitted to Cardiff members of the public will have an opportunity to comment on the application directly to the Cardiff planning authority. The planning application itself will be available on Cardiff Council's website for comments.

If the outline planning is approved they then plan to look for builders who want to progress with the development. That will involve future detailed planning applications. It is vital we stay involved in the process at all stages. This development will have a major impact on the character of Creigiau and there are many concerns surrounding the insufficient transport network in particular, as well many other concerns such as schools, drainage, access, and of course the continuing loss of green spaces.

County Council Notes

It's been a summer of disruption, in particular around Llantrisant Road. Everyone will have been affected in some way by the complete closure of Llantrisant Road to rebuild the road culvert (drainage). This essential work was something that the Council had to do at some point and was not connected to the new development. It was deliberately timed to commence during the school holidays but did take the full 3 weeks allocated. Council Officers were very conscious of the impact and worked hard with partner agencies such as highways, road signage, busses, emergency services, etc. It was a real eye opener just how many departments this impacted.

We also saw more information on the plans for Site E (See main article) for 650 houses following the first mention in the last edition. Thanks to all the residents that came to the planning consultation day in July. It was a great chance for the planners and Councillors to hear the concerns of those most impacted. However, the consultation was only a pre-application event to an outline planning application in August which will need full scrutiny.

It was welcome to see a change on dog controls in Cardiff's parks and open spaces. In 2018 the Council consulted on new laws for dog controls in the city. Out of all of them, the proposal to stop dogs crossing marked sports pitches was deeply unpopular and we joined a campaign

for this aspect to be dropped. Over 500 dog owners and their dogs marched on City Hall to get this result. However, we still need to push the Cabinet for better enforcement of the current rules.

The liaison committees with both Persimmon Developments and Tarmac are both well established so that we can give community feedback to the developers and of the new building site and the Quarry owners. These committees involve the Pentyrch Community Council and other groups which are impacted. If you have any points to make about these huge developments, please let us know so we can pass it on. The meetings are also a valuable insight into their plans and as we learn of key developments, they will be passed on. The next round of meetings will take place after the summer holidays. DOG CONTROLS

Cardiff Council carried out a consultation on dog controls for 6 weeks from the 10th September to the 22nd October 2018. In total, there were 6,002 responses to the public consultation. As a result a revised draft order was put out for further consultation. There were

limited responses to this and on 18th July 2019 the Council approved the Public Space Protection Order. This order includes:-

1. The prohibition of dog fouling (unless it is immediately removed) in all public spaces owned and/or maintained by the Council.
2. The requirement for a dog owner to have a means of clearing dog fouling.
3. The exclusion of dogs in all enclosed playgrounds and schools, which are owned and / or maintained by Cardiff Council.
4. The requirement that dogs are kept on a lead within all cemeteries owned and / or maintained by Cardiff Council.
5. A requirement allowing authorised officers to give a direction that a dog (s) be put and kept on a lead if necessary.
6. The fixed penalty notice charge for a breach of a Public Spaces Protection Order for dog controls, as set out above, is set at £100.
7. The dog controls will be exempt for persons who have a disability that affects the person's mobility, manual dexterity, physical co-ordination or ability to lift, carry or otherwise move everyday objects, in respect of a dog trained by a registered charity and upon which the person relies for assistance.

HATS OF TO CEMEX

Over the last 3 years PNW has been trying to achieve a safe access route to and from Cefn Buchan, Clos Cefn Buchan, Clos Heol Goch and Berthlwyd. Until now villagers have had to literally take their lives in their hands by using the main road by the cenotaph which has no pavement, walk across rocks or, use a footpath which was secluded and unlit. The footpath which travels to Heol Y Pentre behind the play area close to the cenotaph was a solution but to make it safe at night a light was needed at the point where the footpath splits into two by the power sub station. This essential safety measure attracted some opposition on the grounds that 'it would spoil the rural nature of the village'. There were also difficulties in establishing the owner of the small triangle of land where the light needed to be located. PNW detailed its objective and the problems to Pentyrch Community Council (PCC). This met with a very positive response and from that point on we worked in close partnership to find a solution. Thanks to PCC it was established that the second footpath running between the cenotaph and play area was not a bridleway as originally thought and, as a consequence, could be brought up to a standard whereby people of all ages and ability could use the footpath safely even after dark.

Funding was clearly going to be a problem for this sizeable project but following a joint approach by PNW and PCC to quarry owners CEMEX, CEMEX very generously agreed to finance the project supplying both materials and labour. It is hoped that by the end of August 2019 the new footpath will be fully completed. PNW would like to publicly thank PCC for their excellent support. Also both PNW and PCC offer huge thanks to CEMEX for this superb gesture and willingness to help villagers in Pentyrch. The footpath will be a significant improvement to the village and be greatly appreciated by many. For PNW this was our second time of working with CEMEX. The first being the erection of the substantial steel barrier at the former entrance to the two quarries halfway up Pentyrch hill (Heol Goch). This had a dramatic impact on reducing flytipping.

NOISEY VEHICLE EXHAUSTS

Pentyrch is a lovely and up to recently a peaceful place to live. Unfortunately we are encountering a growing problem with some drivers who want to change that by driving/riding vehicles that have excessively noisy exhausts at all times of the day and night. These attention seekers are now attracting the wrong type of attention as far as they are concerned. PNW has discussed the problem several times. It is a person's basic right to peacefully enjoy his/her property. The legal position is that if you feel this problem affects the character of our village and interferes with your enjoyment of living in Pentyrch then the Police recommend that the best way to deal with this nuisance problem is to contact Environmental Services via <https://www.srs.wales/en/>

Environmental -Health.aspx, click on Environmental Health, Noise and Air Pollution, then finally Noise Pollution to access a form to submit and register your complaint. As a first step it is always better to try and resolve the problem with the offender if the offender is known to you. If reporting a vehicle you will need its registration plate details. Often the offending vehicles are ones that have been modified to produce the sound they do and often without notifying their insurance company of the modification which could mean their insurance being declared null and void. If you are the driver of one of these noisy vehicles please consider others.

DEBIT/CREDIT CARD HOLDERS

Making these special holders available at just 50p each has proved a real success with villagers. There are now around just 30 left so if you want to help prevent your financial details from being cloned even when in your purse/wallet or pocket then hurry along to Pentyrch Pharmacy who have kindly acted as our 'outlet'. The holders are wafer thin taking up no room at all wherever you keep your cards. We will not be repeating this exercise for some time so don't miss out. 50p to protect your data is a tiny price to pay for your financial well being.

ONLINE GROOMING

All young people have an 'online life' but many do not really appreciate the serious dangers that come from forming online relationships. Knowing the right questions as a parent or guardian can go a long way towards keeping children safe. Sadly this came to late for the Bednar family and in particular 14 year old Breck Bednar who was murdered by Lewis Daynes in 2014. Daynes ran an online server where Breck and several of his friends played games on line. It was through this forum that Daynes groomed Breck over 13 months – telling him a series of lies, turning him against family and friends and eventually luring him to his flat on the promise of handing over a fake business.

Following Daynes eventual sentence of 25 years in prison the Police, in conjunction with the Bednar family produced a short film telling Breck's story. Earlier this year the short film was finally made available in full for public viewing. It is part of a campaign to fight back against on line grooming and in particular help enlighten parents so they can act before it is too late. Through the use of avatars the film captures the events leading up to Breck's death and also features the real 999 call made to the Police by Daynes. Vacancies for Independent Members of the Standards & Ethics Committee

Cardiff Council is seeking to appoint new Independent Members to its Standards & Ethics Committee.

The Standards & Ethics Committee has an important role in promoting and maintaining high standards of conduct of elected members of Cardiff Council and the six Community Councils within its area. If you value local democracy, have a commitment to public service and have the capacity to be independent, objective and strong-minded, then you may be the right person for this role.

The Committee is comprised of five Independent members, one community councillor and three county councillors. We currently have two Independent Member vacancies due to one member stepping down and one member coming to the end of their term. Appointments are made for a term of between 4 to 6 years, and may be extended for a further 4-year term.

Members of ethnic minority communities and disabled people are currently under-represented on the Committee, so applications from members of these groups are particularly welcome, although all applications will be considered on merit.

- former councillors or officers of Cardiff Council; or
- former councillors or officers of any other local authority, National Park authority, fire authority, or community council, *unless* the person ceased to hold that position more than 12 months ago

20 Years of Pentyrch Open Gardens



The first year, over 20 gardens opened their gates to visitors and the weekend was a tremendous success; the decision was quickly made to 'do it again', and an annual event was born. We have raised in excess of £68,500 which has been used to fund projects in the village and latterly other charities - Macmillan, City Hospice and Wales Air Ambulance. We also pay and manage the planters around the village and with the Community Council purchased our War memorial benches.

This year was no exception - we had 494 visitors over the weekend not counting the children that attended free of charge. Distribution of

Some just happen upon our advertisements, others return year after year to watch developments in the gardens, for gardening is never static and a garden is never 'finished' - there is always a new idea to try out or a new plant to fit in. As well as finding inspiration for their own gardens, many handy tips and ideas are exchanged, maybe a few cuttings too!

One of the guiding principles of Pentyrch Open Gardens from the very start was that there is no competition; there are no judgements about which gardens are suitable, and no 'winners'. Villagers are welcome to join in and show off their pride and joy. Everyone has their own favourite

garden - but there is never agreement (between villagers or visitors) about which is best - it depends what you like.

So, you will find all manner of gardens in Pentyrch, ranging from extensive landscaped lawns to tiny bijou back gardens, from productive kitchen gardens to glorious riots of herbaceous colour. One feature that unites them is their owners' enthusiasm. We love our gardens and want to share them with you!

The broad variety of exciting gardens is complemented by excellent refreshments in the Village Hall and a sizeable plant sale. Courtesy buses are available should your legs get weary.

Visitors regularly comment on the friendliness of the villagers, which has helped contribute to the ongoing success of this annual event.

Who wants to close their street for a day?

Child Friendly Streets: As part of the attempt to make Cardiff a Child Friendly City, Cardiff Council can close roads once a month, for two hours, to allow free street play. There are 13 slots for streets currently available. For your street to qualify it can't be a bus route and must be safe to close. They can facilitate lane/alley closures as well. Life on the verge: wildflower gift from Cardiff Council

Cardiff Council are known for their long and wonderful history of managing our Parks, but they also take care of the verges and many of our Green Open Spaces, and this year, they brought the wilder side of their horticultural skills to Creigiau and sowed wildflowers across different parts of the village.

Keeping things as natural as possible, and using native wildflowers, these areas are now starting to flower. It will be interesting to see how these areas develop and which flowers pop up as the summer progresses.



Not only are wildflowers pretty to look at, they are extremely important for our native wildlife, providing hunting and feeding grounds for many insects, mammals and birds.

We all know the work involved in preparing and maintaining grass verges and by allowing some of these areas to be more natural, with flowering plants, it makes it more colourful and interesting, especially to wildlife, as well as a little less grass to mow. There are so many advantages to reducing the monotonous nature of short grass verges, that there seems no reason not to. Budgets are tight and Cardiff Parks always need to make a little spread a long way, so it is great, that this year, they were able to include us and create something interesting and biologically valuable right here in our community. Ash dieback has sadly arrived

Ash trees are widespread across our community and sadly, the fungal disease known as Ash dieback has arrived. It is widespread throughout the UK and is one of the most significant tree diseases to affect the UK since Dutch elm disease. Once infected, most trees will die, although it is hoped that some may have a genetic tolerance and survive. This is one of the main reasons why there is not a mass national felling programme.

It is easy to notice ash dieback because literally the tree starts dying from the end of its branches backwards. If you look up at an ash tree's canopy, you will see the ends of the branches will not have leaves and, close-up, the branches look black. Eventually, the tree becomes brittle, loses branches and finally, succumbs to the disease.

In addition, if the disease gets into the base of the tree trunk, affected trees can become unstable and dangerous very quickly, especially if other diseases are present. This sort of infection can occur really speedily, without any obvious dieback symptoms in the canopy.

Key organisations such as the

Forestry Commission, Sustrans Cardiff County Council, and Pentyrch Community Council are all aware that the disease is in our area and it has been logged in the Tree Alert forestry disease database.

Over the next few years, there is sadly, no doubt that we will see some ash trees dying and there will need to be extra vigilance by everyone in checking and inspecting trees as well as some timely tree surgery or felling, for safety reasons.

Tree planting by local residents

Living in our community, you might think that we have lots of trees and hedges and that there is no need for more. That is obviously so very wrong. The massive housebuilding will inevitably introduce a more built-up feel to our area and trees will really help to soften that impact.

We also, all of us, need to be better about successional planning and this is as true for trees and hedges as it is for people and organisations. Without succession planting we could get an issue known as 'canopy crisis'



when the lovely mature trees reach the end of their natural life, keel over during a storm, or die from disease and suddenly, there is a gap. Right now, we have ash dieback in the community which means we will almost certainly lose some ash trees over the next few years.

So, on a sunny Sunday morning in June, families from Queen Charlotte Drive and Keep Creigiau Tidy, planted 6 lovely British native trees on their community green. It will be lovely in years to come to see how both children and trees grow with age. Some bird boxes, provided by the clerk to the Council, Helena Fox, also went up at the same time, thanks to the help of the suitably named Rob & Bev Raven.

Over the course of the next year, Keep Creigiau Tidy would like to plant more native British trees around the community. Now, we may have been a tad too ambitious (or successful) in that we are the lucky recipients of a really large number of trees from both Octopus Energy and the Woodland Trust. These will be available to plant in the Autumn and so if you are interested in 'hosting' and 'parenting' a tree or two, please get in touch: amanda.thorpe@pentyrch.cc or @Tidy Creigiau.

The Council will be taking photos of "careful littering", e.g. bags placed next to a bin, or dog poo bags tied to trees, to show that just because it is careful littering it is still littering and carries a fine of £100 for anyone caught. If you want to get involved and tweet examples you come across that would be great! Note: This obviously does not include the litter picking pink bags which are deliberately left next to the bins by arrangement by litter picking groups.

Reducing the waste we send to landfill.

Over the last 100 years the amount of waste humanity produces has increased by almost 10,000%. 25% of this ends up in our oceans, most of the rest is mummified in landfills. We are in the middle of a global garbage crisis.

Here in our local community we are



doing something about this! Crisp packets, popcorn, pretzel and nut bags, chocolate bar wrappers and sweet packaging are not currently recyclable through council collections schemes. They all have to go into our black bins and go to landfill.

So, we have become a member of Terracycle – a global organization collecting the non recyclable and turning it into new products. Pentyrch Terracycle have bins outside the Spar in Pentyrch, boxes in the PCC offices, collections at the Kings Arms and Lewis Arms from the snacks they sell and Pentyrch and Creigiau primary schools. In addition, one of our residents has set up a collection of Contact Lens packaging for us. We even have people collecting at work places now too. The empty packaging is sent to Terracycle and is turned into plastic pellets to be made into playground equipment, park benches, plant pots, watering cans and more.

At our current rate, in one year we will have sent

off enough packaging to fill a 40 foot container – that's a lot of waste not going to landfill and we should be very proud of this.

In addition, for every 2 kilos of material we send off we get £2 towards the charity of our choice - at the moment this is Pentyrch Memorial Park fund - but this can become other charitable causes in time.

We have recently received a donation from Garth Rotary who have generously paid for us to have a third bin outside the Spar so that I can apply for a new collection scheme for cleaning product packaging and also for a large grey wheelie bin to be located on my drive so that work place schemes and those who have bags to hand over can drop them off without filling up the Spar bins in one go.

St Catwg's Church Organ Refurbishment Project.

St Catwg's Church has a good pipe organ that was installed in 1910.

At the time the vestry (priest's robing room) measured 13ft 6in. long by 6ft 10in deep with a sloping roof. To house an organ demanded a bigger room. After a rebuild the room measured 13ft 6in. by 16ft 3in. Subsequently an organ was purchased. However, it was not until 1910 that the work was completed: Thomas Gardiner appointed as the organ blower at 6d a service. This was a large financial commitment from the Church Council.



As with anything with so many moving parts there comes a time when some have to be replaced and that is the stage that we have reached now with St Catwg's organ. Improvement work was undertaken over thirty years ago. The organ described by a Fellow of the Royal College of Organists as: "A very good organ for a church of this size", now needs further work.

An appeal has been launched to raise money so that we can undertake the work that is likely to mean that the organ will be in good condition for the next fifty years at least.

Alongside envelopes at services in the Church Hall, St David's, St Ellteyrn's and St Catwg's Churches a "Just Giving" opportunity is on the website www.parishofpentyrch.org.uk

There will also be a number of fundraising activities that I hope you will feel able to support.

I now buy large cartons of washing liquid, washing up liquid and toilet cleaner, shampoo and conditioner which I refill at a shop in Penarth. I use Ecover which has less chemicals Which is recommended if you have had breast cancer like me. I have started buying more veg and fruit from a real fruit and veg shop as they have all their produce loose. I try not to get plastic bottles of sauces, honey, etc. Toothbrush have wooden handles and no plastic straws.

I look at the huge wardrobe of plastic in my clothes and see how with each wash it goes out into the greater world.



Field Trip to the Great Bustard Project in Wiltshire

It was a bright, warm day when we arrived at a village hall car park in Wiltshire, to be transported to the Great Bustard Project Release Site, somewhere on Salisbury Plain.

Looking over the playing fields and hedgerows, bullfinch, blackcap and chiffchaff were seen. Also noted were lesser whitethroat, mistle thrush, goldfinch and pied wagtail. Whilst swallow and swifts were seen flying across the fields.

On the bumpy ride in the Land Rover to the release site, pheasant and red-legged partridge were spotted on the undulating pastures of Salisbury Plain. Skylark, swallow and carrion crow were also present. From the Hide at the release site, we were lucky to have superb views of male and female great bustards. The males were stately strutting around and some were displaying, a remarkable sight as they puffed up their chests and seemed to turn themselves inside out!

A kestrel had made its home in the nest box on the side of the Hide so we had splendid close up views of the bird flying past us. A corn bunting was also seen.

After our visit to the Hide, we were then taken to the Great Bustard Project shop where we could buy souvenirs of our trip.

SMILE – YOU ARE ON CAMERA



Some months ago South Wales Police (SWP) carried out a local survey to establish the top priorities that villagers had in terms of problems needing urgent attention. Not surprisingly the top two were speeding and parking. Reduced financial resources meant that SWP were having difficulties in holding regular speed checks and so local volunteers were recruited to undertake a Police check then training in the use of hand held Police speed cameras. It was agreed that they would carry out speed checks across the two busiest villages of Pentyrch and Creigiau.

At the time of writing 5 speed checks have been completed with 36 drivers being caught exceeding the speed limits including one person who was also using her mobile phone at the time. The offenders have been/are being contacted by SWP. Bronllwyn, Lon y Fro and Heol y Pentre are the worst roads for speeding in Pentyrch with Ffordd Dinefwr and Cardiff Road in Creigiau.

We are seeking more volunteers so we can increase the frequency of speed checks. More spot checks will be carried out at regular intervals on a random basis and at various times. The need for these speed checks is indicative of the general standard of driving in the villages at the moment. Speeding, failing to stop at junctions, cutting corners and driving in the middle of the road is common place.

With so many children and less mobile older residents in our villages the chances of a serious incident are high so drivers do everyone a favour and WATCH YOUR SPEED or SMILE FOR THE CAMERA
