# Community Council Highlights

#### **ORCHARD AT FAIRMEADOW**

During the summer months the Community Council asked residents for their views on the creation of a community orchard at Fairmeadow It was suggested that residents could participate in tree planting and the subsequent harvesting of the fruit.

Whilst many residents were supportive of the idea there were also a significant number who recognised the difficulties that could be caused due to the limited vehicle access to Fairmeadow.

Due to the comments received, and the on-going work required to maintain an orchard, the community council decided not to proceed with the creation of an orchard.

Instead, the community council has agreed that Coed Caerdydd can undertake some tree planting at Fairmeadow, but not fruit trees that require ongoing maintenance.

The community council remains committed to reducing its carbon footprint through tree planting and other initiatives. We are very grateful for the offers of support in relation to Fairmeadow and will be pursuing other projects which may provide further opportunities for residents.

#### REPLACEMENT LOCAL DEVELOPMENT PLAN

Cardiff Council prepared a draft plan for the period 2021-36, and until 5th October 2023 interested parties were able to submit comments.

The plan is vitally important to our communities as it determines where there can be new housebuilding.

Within the area of the community council there were a number of suggested sites for new housebuilding. All of these were on greenfield sites and the community council objected to these proposals. The community council questioned the population growth projections which underpin the need for housebuilding and was strongly of the view that brownfield sites should be used.

The community council invited the Chief Planning Officer to a public meeting in order that residents were able to ask questions about the draft plan. The meeting was very well attended with 96 people coming to Pentyrch Village Hall.

It is clear that residents have very strong views on the Replacement Local Development Plan and the community council submitted a very detailed response to Cardiff Council.

#### **ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT**

The Community Council have received an enquiry questioning the environmentally friendly status of the Community Link. This has been raised with our printer who has advised us of the following:-

The printer used complies with ISO 14000:2004 Environmental Management System.

Paper is FSC registered and is fully recyclable (FSC is the internationally recognised organisation of Forest Management)

Printing Inks are Vegetable Based

All chemicals and plates used within the printing process are recycled.

#### Dear Resident

#### **Pentyrch Surgery Development**

We recognise it has been many months since there has been any communication on the Pentyrch Surgery development and therefore wish to update you on the progress of the new surgery and also our plans to move forward with this development.

As a Health Board we remain committed to the Pentyrch branch Surgery development to provide modern, purpose-built primary care facilities to the local population, as well as expanding services within this area.

The only viable site for this development remains the Rhydlafar Drive site, and we are working with Llandaff and Pentyrch Surgeries and other key stakeholders to engage with interested parties, including registered patients and the wider community, to get their views on how we can ensure the new surgery is accessible; an element that emerged as a significant concern during the engagement process.

Whilst it was originally hoped that work would start on site as early as 2021, this has been delayed for a number of reasons, beyond the Health Board's control. These factors have resulted in a significant delay to the programme and we are currently working to agree a clear timeline within which the development will be taken forward, to include a date for works starting on site and expected completion/opening of the new development. We will share information on this once confirmed.

Over the coming months there will be further communication to explore options for ensuring reasonable accessibility to the new surgery including potential transport solutions.

We will be sharing a survey with both patients and the wider community of Pentyrch that can be completed either on-line or in paper format. We are really seeking to understand your needs and we would therefore encourage you to participate in the survey so that we can develop solutions that aim to support patient access to the new surgery.

We hope this helps provide an update on the current situation and the plans for Pentyrch branch Surgery and reassures you we will be working with you to ensure the new surgery is accessible.

#### "AN EXCITING OPPORTUNITY TO DEVELOP NEW SKILLS AT ITV CYMRU WALES." By Councillor Sara Pickard

As I have just celebrated my 40th birthday I thought it would be a good time to look back on all the incredible employment opportunities that I have been able to take advantage of over the past 20 years or so. As a person with Down's Syndrome, the odds of me being able to have worthwhile job opportunities were, at the time, said to be very low....and, unfortunately, still are for so many people with disabilities.

After school and college I was able to get my first job as a receptionist at Craig-Y-Parc School in Pentyrch before securing a post as a Project officer with Mencap Cymru, where I still work today. I have had many opportunities to lead on a number of different projects which have mainly involved working in schools and colleges, particularly working with young people with learning disabilities across the whole of Wales.

I have also been very fortunate that Mencap Cymru have allowed me to take advantage of a number of secondment opportunities that have come up during my time at Mencap Cymru.

The first of these was back in 2008 and 2009, which enabled me to develop my passion for drama with Hijinx Theatre Company, which is based at the Wales Millennium Centre. After rigorous rehearsals I was able to join a group of professional actors to perform in two touring productions in theatres across the UK.

My next secondment opportunity came in 2021 when I was appointed as a Disabled Peoples Employment Champion within the Welsh Government. This was a great opportunity to seek to increase the number of people with disabilities in Wales who are in employment. Although T thoroughly enjoyed this year-long secondment, unfortunately, it was during the Covid lockdown, so I had to work entirely from home. Although I was provided with all the technology to carry out my job from home, I did miss contact with people. As a result, despite being offered an extension to my secondment, I made the decision to return to Mencap Cymru in 2022 where I was able to take up a new role as the Engagement Officer.

Part of this work was to establish a new partnership between Mencap Cymru and ITV Cymru Wales. I was delighted to be given the opportunity to have a 5-week secondment as a member of staff at ITV Cymru Wales during July and August 2023. I learnt so much but it was pleasing that when I left ITV staff said they had learnt a lot too as few of the staff had any direct experience of meeting someone with a learning disability, let alone working alongside them!



One of the many highlights was being able to co-present an episode of the political programme 'Sharp End' during Learning Disability Week. I was able to film a package to examine the progress made since the introduction of the All-Wales Strategy in 1983....the year that I was born! This involved interviewing a number of people including Assembly Minister, Julie Morgan MS. On the programme I then interviewed three Assembly members about their reaction to my film. As well as attending the Royal Welsh Show and the National Eisteddfod with ITV Cymru, 'I had the opportunity to attend the ITV Summer Reception in the Speaker's Garden in Westminster where I met a lot of celebrities, including the Speaker himself, Lindsay Hoyle. It was great to have the



chance to meet and chat to many ITV celebrities including Dermot O'Leary, my favourite from 'The Chase',



Ann Hegerty ('The Governess'), Tina O'Brian (Sarah from 'Coronation Street'), Torvill and Dean, Alan Titchmarsh and also, as a huge fan of 'Strictly Come Dancing', I also had a bit of a dance with Ed Balls....I only said I liked him on 'Strictly' and he asked me to dance!!

So, now I am back at

Mencap Cymru where I really hope to bring some of what I have learned back into my role. Huge thanks to my Director at Mencap Cymru who allowed me to take up these wonderful opportunities and a massive thank you to all the staff at ITV Cymru Wales in Cardiff Bay who made me so welcome from Day 1, and special thanks to Rob Osbourne, had who the confidence in me to let me co-



present 'Sharp End' with him, and to Elin Llyr who planned and managed my secondment. I shall miss them all.

So, what comes next???.....who knows? There are lots of exciting plans to develop our work with Mencap Cymru, including our social media presence, so you can follow us there!!

I am often asked what my advice would be to others with learning disabilities. I always say: ...'whatever opportunities come your way, never doubt yourself or say no, you just need to believe in yourself that you can achieve anything you set your mind to'.

I also thoroughly enjoy my role as a Community Councillor for Pentyrch and am currently leading on a project, with the Principal of Craig-y-Parc School, Claire Spring, to help integrate the work of the school more in to our community by engaging with our local community groups. Some of this work has already started but we hope it will develop much further in the coming year.

I was also very pleased to be asked to speak at a conference at the Senedd in October entitled 'We Belong Here: Women's Takeover of the Senedd'. I was asked to speak about the need to encourage more women with disabilities to become involved in politics.

So, my 'story' goes on and I hope you have enjoyed hearing about my latest 'chapter'.

#### **BECOMING A COMMUNITY COUNCILLOR**

Reading the Link at the beginning of 2022 I saw that our Community Council needed new members, curious I attended one of the Community Council Finance meetings which appeared well managed and gave me an idea of the scope, so I had a chat to the Clerk about becoming a Councillor.

She was encouraging and advised how to apply. In June 2022, while recovering from Covid, I was coopted onto the community council.

It was a daunting at first but I was encouraged by neighbours and friends.

The Clerk gave me guidance and recommended online training sessions and experienced councillors provided welcome advice.

After a few months I was able to start being active representing our community.

This summer, in my role as Chair of the Council, I was fortunate to be able to help the local community give feedback to Cardiff Council on the Preferred Strategy Document for the Revised Local development Plan.

Being a Community Councillor can be challenging and I am certainly learning all the time. The Clerk is there to provide guidance and we are fortunate that each Councillor brings their strengths and knowledge to PCC and many talented people within our community are willing to give their time and expertise on specific topics.

A quick update from me. Work has included:

Identifying the landowner and locating a land manager who agreed to replace a section of dangerous path between houses at Parc y Fro and Heol Creigiau. They paid for resurfacing and the council's Public Rights of Way team were then able to adopt the path. Hopefully, now, a resident's suggestion of Coed Caerdydd planting new trees on Parc y Fro green space, that the path connects with, can be consulted with residents near it.

I objected to any new large scale development on land not already with planning permission (Plasdwr) as part of the Replacement Local Development Plan (LDP) candidate site consultation.

I helped to get the Head of Planning to attend a lively and very well attended event at Pentyrch Village Hall regarding LDP consultation.

Following a Pentyrch resident's question, I helped identify two council -owned sites within Pentyrch and Gwaelod y Garth for a council project underway to consider communal electric car charging points.

I've been assisting some residents with various planning applications and concerns with council housing.

I attended the Lan Memorial Woodland volunteer event.

I'm helping the community council with the formation of a formal bus stop on Heol Goch, having a productive meeting with a Cabinet Member and council officer where it was discussed.

A request for double yellow lines at the Heol Goch and Heol y Pentre junction was turned down but an officer is having a look at it once more.

#### PENTYRCH SURGERY / PHARMACY UPDATE

Apologies to those already aware of some of the following information. We are conscious that many in (and beyond) the village do not, or are not able to, follow Facebook posts updating our community. Newsletters are expensive and do not reach all affected areas outside Pentyrch. PNW funds the activities of Pentyrch Save Our Surgery & Pharmacy (PSOS&P) but we rely totally on donations for all our activities.

The good news is, things are now gathering pace. The Health Board (HB) have agreed to include PSOS&P on its Transport Group set up to try and resolve the acute access problems of a potential surgery in Rhydlafar. This means PSOS&P will have a say on the intended survey regarding access and its outcome. PSOS&P will now also have regular meetings with the Chair and CEO of the HB. In addition, PSOS&P will meet Llais (former Community Health Council) every 6 weeks. Following an excellent meeting between PSOS&P and 2 Pentyrch Community Councillors at the first meeting of PCC's Transport Committee, PCC has written to the HB echoing the concerns of both PSOS&P and Llais over the content

#### SPEED CHECKS

By the time you read this article, speed checks in Pentyrch should have resumed. It was noticeable that speeding increased when checks were suspended. Bronllwyn, Lon y Fro, Church Rd and particularly Heol y Pentre bear the brunt of speeds frequently in excess of 30mph. Offenders include delivery vans, coaches, the 136 bus service and lorries plus, our refuse collectors.

#### VILLAGE WIDE MEETING

Sadly, just 13 people attended the recent public meeting arranged by PNW to hear 2 speakers from HSBC on the subject of financial scams. Everyone who attended found the event very helpful and informative.

#### NOT GOT WOT YOU DIDN'T ORDER?

As we approach Christmas there will be a surge in scam messages telling us our parcel could not be delivered due to insufficient postage being paid or, that the Amazon account you have (or not), has been scammed with your account being or about to be debited for goods you didn't authorise. Scams offering money to help with energy costs providing you submit your bank details are another. Busy lives can mean we are prone to believing these very professional scams and so part with our money for nothing in return. PAUSE, THINK TWICE before acting and NEVER divulge your personal details e.g. PIN numbers, passwords.

Now the bad news! Pentyrch surgery patients have received a letter from the HB referring to a survey of patients only which will be conducted by the surgery. The letter adds the HB will be sharing a survey with patients and the wider community of Pentyrch. This infers 2 different surveys conducted by 2 separate bodies. The affected community in our case is not just Pentyrch. It includes Creigiau, Gwaelod y Garth, Capel Llanilltern and (if it is to be the chosen site) Rhydlafar. All have patients and potential patients of Pentyrch Surgery. It is the responsibility of the HB to carry out surveys not those contracted to provide healthcare services.

Neither PNW nor PSOS&P know of anyone opposing a new surgery. The dispute is firstly about the HB not complying with legal requirements to engage and consult the affected community from the outset and throughout. Secondly, the HB having used an evaluation process lacking any credibility to determine which of 6 shortlisted sites (5 in Pentyrch) should be chosen and finally, the loss of the highly valued Pentyrch Pharmacy used by patients and non patients alike.

#### SOUTH WALES LISTENS

South Wales Police have launched a replacement for the long since demise of 'Community Messenger'. South Wales Listens is a service designed to improve communications with the public. It is a free service. It provides an opportunity for people to express concerns and for the Police and other services to try and improve situations. It also publicises criminal activity in our area and invites participation in surveys and events. It is NOT a replacement for 999 (it's happening now) or 101 (after the event) calls.

#### IT'S TRUE!

There really is a Father Christmas. We know this because our children tell us so. He is the reason there are lots of presents under the tree on Christmas Day along with a half eaten carrot and an empty glass. So it is especially important at this time of year to be security minded to ensure presents reach those to whom they are intended. Timers to switch lights on and off at various times are cheap to buy as are decent locks for doors and windows similarly, movement alarm detectors. Camera door bells are an excellent deterrent. All are easily fitted. If you are away don't publicise it. Resist the urge to tell the world what a good time you are having perhaps abroad somewhere, by posting pictures etc on social media.

The Charity Trustees keep fighting to get the facilities that our village deserves. After several meetings with our Architect, Lloyd Britton, we are very close to agreeing the configuration of the Pavilion Extension. This will include the storage we will need to ensure that we can fully utilise the space we have. We will shortly be looking at planning for Solar Panels and either Ground or Air Heat pumps, being extremely keen that the "green" agenda is fully met.


We are exploring funding options, including applying for the allocation of some Section 106 funds (contributions from housing developers towards the costs of providing community and social infrastructure). These funds are accessed via Cardiff City Council and our City Councillors have expressed their approval of our plans. However as yet we have not heard of any progress with allocation of monies. If any resident is in contact with our City Councillors please mention and support our cause.

The PCC is, as usual are being very helpful. Their Maintenance Officers (Gary and Colin) have recently positioned a fence on their land behind the hedge by the Tennis Courts to ensure that walkers use the Kissing Gate. This was necessary to allow us to secure the boundary to prevent animals and motorbikes coming through a gap and causing damage and perhaps putting users at risk. PCC contractors have also carried out extensive work to fell trees infected by the Ash dieback fungus.

The Charity is engaged with Railway Paths Ltd and Tarmac to improve the path that gives safe access to "The Rec" alongside the extremely busy road. Together we are awaiting approval of our plans to resurface the path which has been worn away by water running off the entrance to the coach park. This will then enable easier use of Buggies and Pushchairs, and allow many more residents of all ages to use a safe and user friendly environment.

Finally, I ask all our readers to visit our web site www.creigiaurec.com and to support our plans by joining "Friends of the Rec". Despite being frugal our fixed costs continue to grow, currently over £4,000 per year. We plan to release Newsletters and arrange meetings to keep those that donate informed of our plans and take feedback so if you walk your dog on the field, take your children to play, join in any sports or just love your village and wish future generations get the facilities they deserve, please "sign up".






The Pentrych TerraCycle Team are delighted to welcome Craig Y Parc School to the scheme and we look forward to working with the staff and children to raise awareness of waste reduction and recycling. Since the TerraCycle scheme restarted, collectively we have now recycled 1,209.44 kilograms of plastic waste. Instead of this waste ending up in landfill it has been recycled into outdoor furniture, watering cans, storage containers and much more. Please continue to support the scheme and share with family and friends, getting them involved. Not only is Pentrych TerraCycle helping our environment it generates cash for the community. We currently have accrued just over £400. Therefore, we are setting up a small grants scheme which local community groups can access. Dyfrig Davies, oldest man in the village put a wreath there and standing beside a young child from the school. People were standing. Crying, some of them.

Let's make a memorial, someone said. That's when it all began. Cemex chipped in - they would put in paths. Norma Procter agreed to get going on it. I put up my hand – so did Sara Thorne. Since then, I've looked after that place. Colin Coughlin and me - we loved it there. Cared for it daily. I met so many people at the Lan... local people, visitors.

As time passes we get older. I can't do what I used to do down there. I still go to the help days with Richie from the council – Sara is always there, but not so many turn up to help these days. That woodland was a total mess when we started. Now well - it's one of the nicest places in the village. Peaceful. Who wants to be the new Lan Ranger? #### AUTUMN WITH GARTH GARDENERS It's autumn so let's talk about hedges

This is the right time of year to cut your hedges. Well managed boundaries are important, for you, your neighbour and the village. Are you encroaching onto your neighbour's property, or growing over a pavement or footpath, now is the time to tackle it.

Reducing height and width, (except the berries = bird food) means future easier maintenance. If cut now the regrowth will be slow and the light trimming in the spring won't disturb the nesting birds.

Take the opportunity to decide what you want from your hedges, privacy, design, a backdrop for planting.

What you can achieve will depend on the type of the hedging plants

Privet is a good standard plant easy to trim and keep tidy, you can achieve a formal sharply defined hedge.

If you have a mixed species hedge, the plants grow with a different rate and habit, so why not go with the flow, cut it with a series of curves to accentuate the different forms of the vegetation, or dramatic cloud pruning and topiary.

Whatever your preference now is the time. Unfortunately, hard woody trimmings won't break down in your compost heap without shredding. So, take them to the tip, well organised and pleasant and helpful staff.



#### MERCHED Y WAWR

In our first meeting of the term Wil Morus Jones took us on a visual tour of the historic town of Pontypridd which will host next year's Nastional Eisteddfod. We learnt about the significance of many interesting locations and characters..



#### Cardiff's Five Towns Gwaelod's One.

Coroner Reece, who led the inquest into the Lan disaster, was born and brought up in Crockherbtown, Cardiff. I had never heard of it. Talking to Arthur Welsby, he was also blank. 'If you get to find out, let me know,' he said. So, I asked Google.



In the nineteenth century, Cardiff had five towns and Crockherbtown was one of them. It was around the area of Queen Street and the Civic Centre, an artisan area when Reece was born – his father was a doctor. Cardiff's leper colony was there – and so was its theatre. Crockherbtown, Crokkerton, Cokkerton or Crockerton – take your pick! The "town of the crock herbs", goes back to 13th Century Monks, trading at herbs at the East Gate. There is still a Crockherbtown Lane off Park Place.

One town down and four to go ! Grangetown (including Riverside and Canton) was easy - it still exists.

In the nineteenth century it was a multiracial district. Butetown, South of the city and near the docks, was a model housing estate built by the Marquis of Bute.

There was also an area called Newtown, known as little Ireland with two hundred houses.

That leaves Temperance Town, a working-class area of the inner city built on reclaimed land by Colonel Wood - hence Wood Street.

Gwaelod y Garth has its town too. Georgetown. That comes from Abraham Phillips' lodger – Mr George. A quarry man, he lived in Wood Cottage with his wife and two children while he built the cottages known as


